- Since the economic recession in the first decade ,Companies prefer pool campus sessions generally held at the premier college of Assam, Cotton College.

- Faculty and Staff recruitment for all vacant posts of administerial /technical staff and faculty posts are advertised in the leading local newspapers.
- Candidates are selected according to the rules and regulations of UGC and Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam.

- The institution does not have a MOU with any industry but the students are taken on industrial visits.

- > During admission, a counselling session is conducted by faculty members regarding the availability of courses, combination of subjects, suitability of the courses.
