01. INTRODUCTION:

Lalit Chandra Bharali College was established on the 9th day of August, 1971, at the initiative of the local people of the area and the co-operation of the enthusiastic employees of the N.F.Rly. Headquarters. It was initially started with Evening Shift Classes at Railway High School. Then the College is shifted to its present site at Nilachalpur.

The untiring effort of some dedicated teachers and the Management has converted it in to a Deficit College in 1983. More than one thousand students enrol annually and are receiving education upto Degree Major Standard under the guidance of a host of dedicated teachers.

02. LOCATION:

The College is situated at the Eastern boundary of the N.F.Railway Head-Quarter at the Foothills of Nilachal Hills, the abode of Goddess Kamakhya. The site of the College with the beautiful Nilachal and Adimgiri Hills which served once as Western Gate of the Mighty Ahoms, gave an ideal atmosphere of peace and serenity for both teaching and learning.

The College is situated hardly 3 K.M. away from Adabari Bus Stand, 5 K.M. from the Gauhati University and easily approachable from all sides.

03. GOAL:

Pursuit of Excellence is our institutional goal. We are looking for excellence in the field of sports, games, in the class-room, laboratories or in toto for institutional excellence.

04. AIMS & OBJECTIVES:

- (1) To impart higher education to the eligible youths in general SC, ST & OBC in particular.
- (2) To arrange remedial teaching for the upliftment of the students of the weaker section.
- (3) To make conscious effort to promote ideas of national integration, secularism, a scientific outlook and a cosmopolitan and a humanistic approach towards life.
- (4) To impart training in Games and Sports, Music, Art and Culture.
- (5) To lay emphasis on teaching and research in non traditional areas avoiding duplication of facilities available in other Colleges.
- (6) To promote among the students and teachers an awareness and understanding of the social needs of the state and prepare them for fulfilling such needs.
- (7) To work for preservation and dissipation of art and culture.

05. ADMISSION :

The College reopens after the Summer Vacation on 16th day of July 1998. Prospectus, Academic Calendar and Application forms for admission to the Higher Secondary / Three year Degree Course Classes can be had from the College office at all working hours with a payment of Rs.30.00 only from 1st July 1998.

06. INTERVIEW CUM ADMISSION SCHEDULE:

The dates for interview cum admission for different courses are scheduled as follows-

- 1-10 July '98 - Issue of Forms & Prospectus etc.
- 12th July '98 - Last date for receipt of Complete forms .
- 17th July '98 - Interview & Admission for B.Sc. Ist Year.
- 21st July '98 - Interview & Admission for B.A. Ist Year.
- 22nd July '98 - Interview & Admission for H.S. Ist Year & Diploma in Computer Science.

N.B. - Students shall have to produce Original Certificates, Mark sheets etc. at the time of interview.

07. REGISTRATION & MIGRATION :

Students from Boards or Universities other than SEBA & G.U. shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

08. ADMISSION COMMITTEE:

An Admission Committee constituted by the Senior members of the different Departments to look after the matters relating to Admission.

09. EXAMINATION:

Apart from the final Examination conducted by the A.H.E.C. and G.U. , the Terminal and Annual Examinations are held under direct supervision of the College authority as notified in the College Academic Calendar.

10. ATTENDANCE:

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly and punctually. Wilful absence from the Class Room lectures will be treated as a serious breach of College discipline. As a rule each student is required to attend in each subject minimum of 65% of the total lectures delivered in each academic session.

10.01 IMPORTANT NOTE ON ATTENDANCE:

A student shall not be eligible to sit for Part I or Part II Examination if he/she has not attended a minimum of 65% lectures delivered in each subject separately.

A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat.

11. COURSE OF STUDIES:

Under Faculty of Arts, the college is imparting teaching in both Higher Secondary and T.D.C. Courses in Arts, While the Faculty of Science is engaged in imparting Teaching in Science and Technology in Three Year Degree Course in Science only.

Besides to meet the growing demands of the students we have also introduced a Diploma course in Computer application of 9 months duration.

11.01 HIGHER SECONDARY(ARTS) :

(a) English Compulsory subjects (b) M.I.L. :- Assamese, Bengali, Hindi and Alt. English (Any one)

The students can select maximum 4 (four) subjects from the following out of which 3 (three) will be compulsory.

Economics, Education, Political Science, History, Logic & Philosophy, Advance language (Assamese/Bengali), Mathematics and Statistics.

11.02. THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE(ARTS) :

Compulsory Subject: (a) English.

(b) M.I.L. - Assamese/Bengali/Hindi/Alt English (Any one).

The students will have to opt for any two elective subjects from the following out of which Major in one subject will be allowed. Economics, Pol-Science, Education, Philosophy, History, Elective Languages (Assamese/Bengali/English), and Mathematics.

11.03 THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE (SCIENCE) :

The College has also opened Three Year Degree Course in Science for B.Sc. Degree of the Gauhati University. One of our objectives is to lay emphasis on teaching and research in Non-traditional areas avoiding duplication of facilities available in other colleges. Keeping the said aim and objectives in view, we have introduced, a few Nontraditional subjects like **Electronics, Computer Science, Environmental Science and Environment & Water management** (vocational subject) in the B.Sc. Course.

11.04 VOCATIONAL SUBJECT :

The UGC has selected our college for starting a Vocational subject of Science & Technology group viz Environment & Water Management from the session-1996-97.

The North Eastern region of India is virtually a virgin area from the view point of environmental studies. Water & Soil Pollution studies in this area have not yet been picked up. Guwahati is the main urban centre of the whole of North-Eastern India, and practically it is the centre of trade, commerce and industry for the region. Situated at the Southern bank of the river Brahmaputra, Guwahati's present population is estimated at 1.5 Million ? The city has grown haphazardly with shopping centres, markets, big hotels, nursing homes and hospitals, bus-truck, rail terminus, garages and workshops, medium and small Industries springing up in almost all localities. An one million Oil Refinery exists in the eastern part of the city at Noonmati. An Oil based thermal power plant operates from the eastern suburb of the city at Chandrapur. The Borjhar Airport which is in the process of being converted into an international airport exists at the Western suburb of the city. Other medium industries located in the city are Carbon Product Manufaacuring Units, Steel Roller Mills, Asbestos factory, big floor mills, Herbicide making unit, Granulated fertilizer plant, Galvanized pipe making units, metal fabrication industries etc. The extremely conjusted scenario of the city coupled with the uneven topography have contributed significantly to the pollution of gross environment. Even people of some localitis complain of corrosive rain too. Hence there is a great demand of trained people to work for the pollution control.

Further, the North-Eastern India comprising the state of Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Mizoram, Tripura, Sikkim is one of the wettest region of the world and received heavy rainfall starting from April till end of September. In the year 1995 there were four waves of flood in Assam. But surprisingly enough, the scarcity of water exists in the state. There is great scarcity of drinking water particularly in the premonsoon time. Similarly thousand hectors of cultivable land remains barren for want of water. This speaks in volume the need of skilled man in the area of water resource management, water quality management and environmental managment. The introduction of the vocational subject may fulfill the requirement of the region to a great extent.

The college has approached the pollution control Board, Assam(PCBA) Assam Science, Technology and Environmental Council (ASTECC) DSTE, Assam and other organizations to support and has received encouraging response. Experts from the Department of Environmental Science and the department of Chemistry of the Gauhati University have agreed to be associated with us as consultants. PHE Dept. of the state will also cooperate with us.

The Engineering subject attributed to the First Degree Programme in this lone College of the Eastern Region, is expected to be highly useful to the students of the North-Eastern Region.

11.05 SUBJECTS OFFERED FOR B.SC. COURSE.

A. Compulsory Subject-English

B. Elective Subjects-[Any Three of the following subjects(the combination are given in the following)] (1) Mathematics (2) Statistics (3) Physics (4) Electronics (5) Computer Science (6) Environmental Science (7) Economics and (8) Environment and Water Management (Vocational Subject) Students can offer major in Anyone of the following subjects only. Mathematics , Economics and Statistics. Students offering the vocational subject must not opt for major in any subject.

12. LIBRARY :

A student has to pay Rs.100.00 as caution money which is refundable at the end. Students may borrow books from the Library against cards. Moreover, they can utilize the reading room facilities. The student must follow the existing rules of the Library. Working Hrs 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. Although , the Library is small in size, it has a good selection of books on various subjects and aims at meeting the needs of students and teachers alike. Rare reference books on many subjects have been purchased to increase the quality of the library. Newspapers, of standing repute are also provided. Selected journals of international standard on Science and humanities are also purchased. Steps have been taken to equip the Library with all modern facilities.

13. PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES:

The student must clear their College dues at the time of admission.

14. IDENTITY CARDS:

An identity card is issued to every student to be possessed by the students during he College hours.

15. TRAVELING CONCESSION :

Students are entitled to student concession on production of identity card as per rule.

16. SCHOLARSHIPS:

Students are awarded both merit and other Scholarships as prescribed by the Govt. of Assam.

17. COLLEGE MERIT PRIZES :

- (a) A student of H.S. class who secures 70% or more marks in aggregate at the Final Examination is awarded the prize worth of Rs.1,000/- (One thousand) only.
- (b) A student of T.D.C. who secures highest aggregate marks with distinction in the T.D.C. Part -II Final Examination is declared to be the best graduate of the year with a special prize both in cash and kinds.

18. STUDENTS ASSOCIATION :

The Lalit Chandra Bharali College Students Union (LCBCSU) is the General Body of the Students of the College. Its membership is compulsory for every Alciiban. Office bearers are elected annually as per constitution of the students union.

19. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES :

The College considers the extension work as the third Dimension of the institution and takes it to be as important as the other two dimensions the research and teaching functions from the point of view of social usefulness and accountability. Hence, extension programme has been taken up out of its own fund plus financial assistance received from Gauhati University. Carried out through NSS unit of the College.

Besides these the College has a few co-curricular association like ' Sahitya Chora' , 'Economics Forum' , 'History & Political Science Forum' through which various activities like Seminar, Extension lecture, Survey etc. have been carried out.

20. GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE :

1. The Societies and Association shall be subject to such guidance and control as the College Administration may prescribe from time to time.
2. Only such societies as have been recognised by the Principal shall have the facilities of the College premises.
3. All notices desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the College premises shall require the approval of the Principal.

Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as major offence against discipline.

- (a) Habitual irregularities.
- (b) Resorting to violence of any kind.
- (c) Disobedience and indecent acts to teachers and to the College authority.
- (d) Damaging, defacing or devaluing any college property.

21. STUDENTS AID FUND :

College has a Students Aid Fund, to help the poor but meritorious students of the college, both in case and kinds.

22. BOOK BANK :

The College has introduced a Book-Bank for helping the deserving students with Text Books and Reference Books.

23. ACADEMIC COMMITTEE :

The college has an Academic Committee to look after the Academic matters of the college. The Academic Committee of the college prepares an Academic Calendar of the College and bears the responsibility of implementing the same.

24. DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE :

There is a Discipline Committee in the College, comprise of Principal, Vice-Principal and three members of the teaching staff to look after the matters relating to students indiscipline. Decision of the Discipline Committee is final and obligatory.

25. EXAMINATION COMMITTEE :

The College Examination Committee is responsible for conducting all examinations including Final, Terminal, Annual, Test Examinations and shall be responsible to conduct the Examination Zone too if allotted to the college.

26. ELECTION COMMITTEE :

There is an Election Committee to conduct the election of L.C.B.C.S.U.

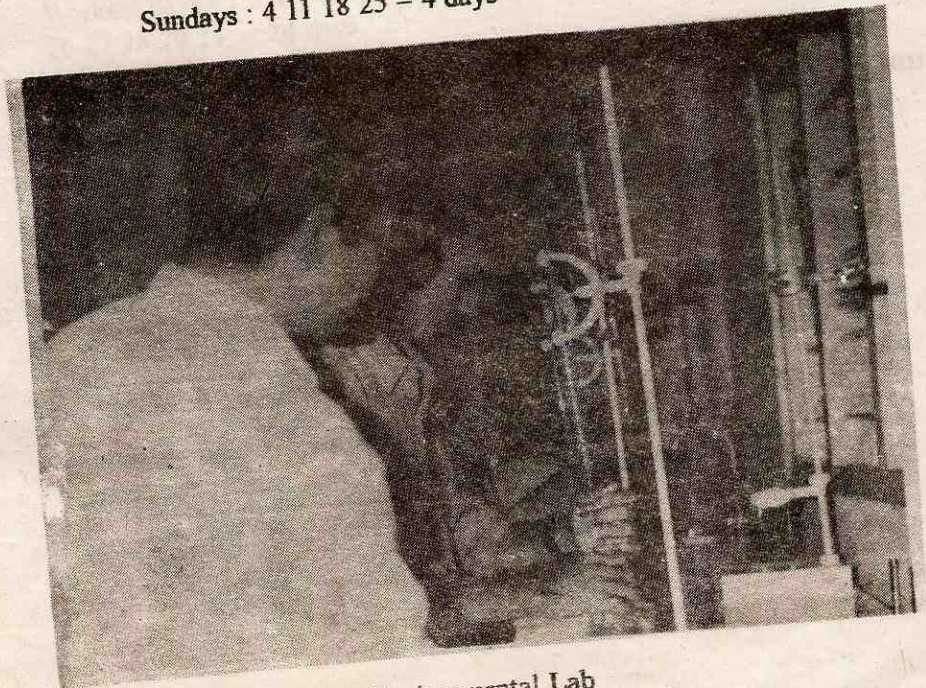

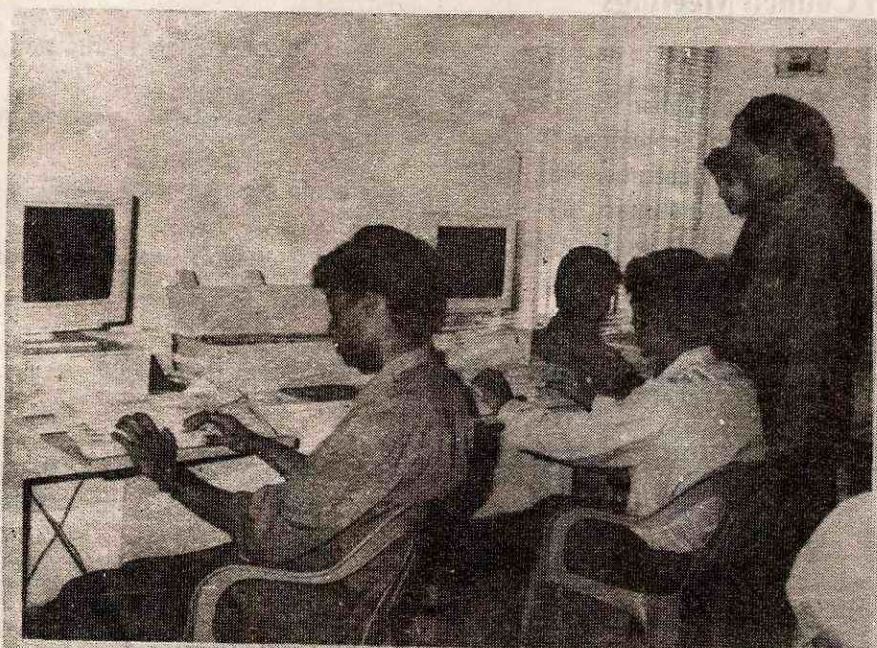

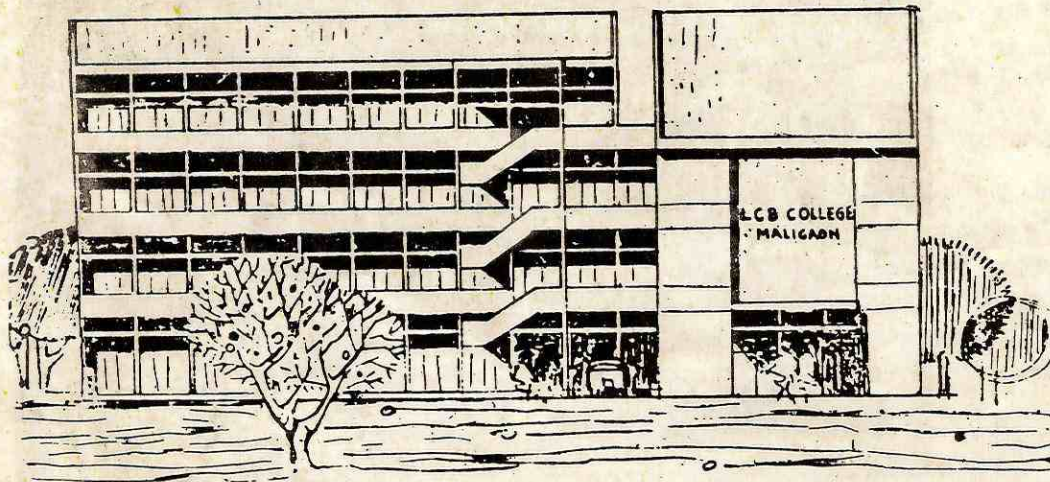
