

SECTION-I

01. INTRODUCTION

Lalit Chandra Bharali College established on 9th August, 1971 and situated at easily accessible location was started at the initiative of the neighbourhood and the generous financial help of the donor after whom the college is named. It was established to cater to the needs of the students of the periphery areas of Guwahati in particular and the state as a whole. The college is situated at the Eastern boundary of the N.F. Railway H.Q. and at the foothills of the Nilachal Hills—the abode of the Goddess Kamakhya. The site of the College with the beautiful Nilachal and Adinggiri Hills which once served as the Western Gate of the Mighty Ahoms, provide an ideal environment of peace and serenity for both teaching and learning.

The College is situated hardly 3 K.M. away from Adabari Bus Stand, 5 K.M. from the Gauhati University, 7 K.M. from the Guwahati Railway Station and is easily approachable from all sides.

The college offers two streams namely Arts and Science and is permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University, registered under UGC (i)-2-F (ii) 12 B since 1994 and is also a member of the Indian College Forum. The college also has a Higher Secondary Section in Arts, affiliated to the AHSEC. The college has recently been accredited by the NAAC as 'B' Grade Institution for 5 years.

The Arts stream of the college came under the Deficit grant in Aid System of the Govt. of Assam in September, 1983. The Science stream, started in 1995 is managed by the college itself. The Arts faculty of the college is imparting teaching in both HS and TDC courses in Arts while the faculty of Science is engaged in imparting teaching in Science and Technology.

02. GOAL :

Pursuit of Excellence is an institutional goal for the college. Quest for excellence in curricular and extra curricular activities, sports, dramatics, arts & culture is a continous process for the college.

03. AIMS & OBJECTIVES :

(1) To impart higher education to the eligible youths in general and SC,

SECTION-III GENERAL INFORMATION

01. INTERVIEW CUM ADMISSION:

The College reopens after the Summer Vacation and the Prospectus cum Academic Calender and Application forms for admission into the Higher Secondary / Three Year Degree Course Classes can be had from the College office at all working hours with a payment of Rs. 80/
- (Rupees Eighty Only) from 16 June 2004.

The dates for interviews cum admission for different courses will be notified through Local Dailies immediately after the publication of the result of SEBA & AHSEC. The admission schedules will also be notified in the college Notice Board.

N. B: Students shall have to produce their Original Certificates, Mark Sheets at the time of interview.

02 REGISTRATION & MIGRATION:

Students from Boards or Universities other than SEBA & G.U. shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

03. EXAMINATION:

Apart from the final Examination conducted by the A.H.E.C. and G.U., the Unit Test, Sessional Test are held under direct supervision of the College authority as notified in the College Academic Calendar.

04. ATTENDANCE :

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly and punctually. Wilful absence from the Class Room lectures will be treated as a serious breach of College discipline. As a rule each student is required to obtain a minimum of 65% attendance of the total lectures delivered in each academic session.

A student shall not be eligible to sit for Final Examination if he/she has not attended a minimum of 65% lectures delivered in each subject separately.

A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat.

05. IDENTITY CARDS:

An identity card is issued to every student to be possessed by him/ her during the College hours.

06. FACILITIES :

(a) Library:

A student has to pay Rs. 100/- (for Arts) and Rs. 300/- (for Science) as caution money which is refundable at the end. Students may borrow books from the Library against cards. Moreover, they can utilize the reading room facilities. The student must follow the existing rules of the Library. Working Hrs. 9 am to 4.30 pm Although, the Library is small in size, it has a good selection of books on various subjects and aims at meeting the needs of students and teachers alike. Rare reference books on many subjects have been purchased to increase the quality of the library. Newspapers of standing repute are also provided. Selected journals of international standard on Science and Humanities are also purchased. Steps have been taken to equip the Library with all modern facilities.

(b) Scholarships:

Students are awarded both merit and other Scholarships as prescribed by the Govt. of Assam.

(c) Travelling Concession:

Students are entitled to student concession on production of identity card as per rule.

(d) College Merit Prizes:

A student of T.D.C. who secures highest aggregate marks in the T.D.C. Final Examination is declared to be the best graduate of the college and the candidate who is Topper/Ranked in the G.U. Examination be awarded of Rs. 5000/- and 7000/- to the candidate (both Science & Arts) respectively in the name of Late Sabitri Bharali.

(e) Students Aid Fund :

The College has a Students Aid Fund formed by contribution of students (Rs. 20/- only each) to help the poor but meritorious students of the college, both in cash and kind. The fund also provides assistance to meet Medical expenses of students when and where required.

(f) Cyber Club:

The college has started a Cyber Club for Internet browsing for all students & teachers of the college. The services are provided by Windows N.T. based sharing of a dial-up connection by P-IV/Celleron PCs. Though the provisions currently are limited, the college hopes to expand the facilities in the near future.

(g) Book Bank:

The College has introduced a Book-Bank for helping the deserving students with Text Books and Reference Books.

(h) Departmental:

- i) Computer Science: The Dept. has a periodically updated A/ C. Laboratory with seating arrangements for about 40 students. The Lab. is mostly formed by P-III/P-IV PCs using Windows-98, 2000/Linux OS.
- ii) Electronics: The Dept. has a periodically undated A/C Laboratory with seating arrangements for about 30 students for basic Electronics practical. There is a separate setup for Digital Electronics with seating arrangement for about 20 students. The Dept. has its own Computational facility for about 15 students. The Computational facility provide Windows-2000/Xp based design experience using Multi-sim, Tinapro, Protel and Matlab.
- iii) Environmental Science: The Dept. has a sophisticated Laboratory which can monitor and record data on rainfall, temperature, humidity, windspeed, water current speed etc. on a continous basis. The Dept. also has a setup to measure air pollution levels and carry out different chemical analysis of contaminated water and soil. One of members of the faculty of the Dept. has recently started a DST (Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India) sponsored project on Tissue Culture.

07. STUDENTS ASSOCIATION:

The Lalit Chandra Bharali College Students Union (LCBCSU) is the General Body of the Students of the College. Its membership is compulsory for every Alcibian. Office bearers are elected annually as per constitution of the Students Union. Students who do not have 65% attendance in the class on the date of submission of Nomination Papers for the post of Office Bearer LCBC Students Union will not be elligible for contest the Election.

SECTION-IV

01. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND **EXTENSION EDUCATION PROGRAMME:**

The College considers extension work as the third dimension of the institution and regards it to be as important as the other two dimensions namely teaching-learning and research. This is due to the consideration that extension activities are beneficial in inculcating a sence of dedication to social upliftment and accountability among students. Hence, the college has taken up extension education with its own fund plus financial assistance received sometiems from Gauhati University. These activities are carried out through the NSS unit of the colege. This is due to the consideration that extension activities are beneficial in inculcating a sence of dedication to social auliftment and accountability among students.

Type of Extension Works:

- Academic Extension Activities: Organisation of departmental lectures, seminars with the involvement of all the teachers & students so that interdiciplinary knowledge can transmit to teachers & students.
- Extension through Awareness: Awareness on Environment (National Environmental Awareness Campaign)

Awareness of primary health, drug abuse, AIDS, Blood donation etc. inside and outside of the college campus.

- National Service Scheme (NSS): The NSS is voluntary organisation of College students under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development established during 1985 to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labour among the youth. The College Unit of the NSS is vibrant with activities and takes up a number of health-education programmes each year under the guidance of the Project Officer Mr. Bijoy Kamal Bhattacharyya.
- National Cadet Corps (NCC): The NCC is a national organisation which has helped in inculcating a spirit of courage, confidence, self-reliance, selfless service, a feeling of patriotism, faith in oneself, power of thought and adjustment which are essential to make the youth disciplined and dutiful. The college is attached to the 50 Assam Air Sqn. (Flg.) NCC for NCC activities under the leadership of Mr. Bikash Bhargab Sarma.
- Appreciation of Arts: The college organises programmes such as Folk Festival, Music, Dance, Drama and Painting workshop cum seminars to help students and teachers develop a sence of appreciation of arts and culture. These are also organised with the aim of creating an awareness about traditional art and culture and its preservation. Besides these the college has a few associations for co-curricular activities like— Sahitya Chora, Economics Forum, History & Political Science Forum and so on through which various activities like Seminars, Extension Lectures, Surveys etc. are carried out periodically.
- L. C. B. College Science Society: The college has a Science Forum namely "L. C. Bharali College Science Society" which is an institutional branch of the Assam Science Society. The LCBCSS undertake various activities round the year for the nourishment of the scientific temper and for promotion and advancement of the cause of Science particularly in applied branches.
- News Bulletin: The college has also a half yearly News Bulletin and yearly News Bulletin on Environment, namely Paribesh Sambad (Environment News). The Departments of History & Political Science jointly publishes a Histro-Political Journal.
- Suggestion Box: Any suggestion from students/parents/guardians/ well wishers related to development of the college may be provided through the suggestion box. The box is opened and the suggestions analysed by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college.
- Student's Feedback Form: Students of all classes are asked to provide their comments regarding teaching/learning/evaluation (teacherwise) through a Feedback Form which is analysis by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college.

SECTION-V VARIOUS COMMITTEES

01. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL:

There is an Internal Quality Assurance Cell which monitors the activities and performances of the students right from the day of admission upto the completion of the courses of study. The cell also acts as a quality check and monitoring mechanism of all spheres fo the teaching-learning process through out the academic session.

02. ACADEMIC COMMITTEE :

The Academic Committee of the College prepares an Academic Calender and bears the responsibility of implementing the same.

03. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL:

There is a Grievance Redressal Cell in the College, comprising of Principal, Vice-Principal and the three members of the teaching staff to look after the matters of grievance and indiscipline related to students and staff of the college. Decision of the cell is final and obligatory.

- Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as major offence against discipline.
 - Habitual irregularities.
 - Resorting to violence of any kind. (b)
 - Disobedience and indecent behavior to teachers and to (c) the College authority.
 - Damaging, defacing or devaluing any College property. (d)
 - All types of singular a group activities leading to the disruption of the congenial atmosphere of the colege will be regreded as efficient and can incrite strictest of disciplinary action.
- 2. All notices desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the College premises shall require the approval of the Principal.

The Grievance Redressal Cell meets whenever such matters are brought into its notice. The cell considers all matters related to grievance redressal of the students & staff and prepares a report occasionaly. In all cases the primary consideration of the cell is overall well being.

04. EXAMINATION COMMITTEE :

The Internal Examination Committee of th College is responsible for conducting Unit Tests, Sessional Test Examinations and Tests Examination. The External Examination committee is responsible for H.S. Final & TDC Part-I & Part-II. There shall be separate Committee in conducting Examination Zone, if allotted to the college.

05. ELECTION COMMITTEE:

There is an Election Committee to conduct the election of the L.C.B.C.S.U.

06. INFORMATION & CAREER GUIDANCE CELL (ICGC):

The Information & Career Guidance Cell provides information and guidance for career advancement and placement avenues for the students of the college. The cell frequently organises different workshops and training programmes like Entrepreneurship Development Programme, Publishes a Wall-Magazine where all information regarding career advancement and placement avenues are displayed on a weekly basis. The co-ordinator of the cell is Dr. (Mrs) Farhin Hazarika.


