

On Solid Waste Management

The College organised a day long Workshop on 'Solid Waste Management' under National Environment Awareness Campaign (NEAC),2004-2005, sponsored by the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India, at Pachgaon H.S. School, Gerua (Kamrup) on 31st May,2005. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. (Mrs.) Krishna Barman, Principal of the College by planting a medicinal plant at 10-30 am.

In the programme, Mr. Madhab Ch. Patowary, Head Master i/c of Pachgaon H.S. School, Dr. Dilip Kumar Deka, HOD, Environmental Science of LCB College and lots of teachers and students participated. At 11 am, an Art Competition was organised among the school students of that area. About 40 students of different communities from the area participated in the competition. The subject of the competition was "Our Environment". At 12-30 noon, the open session was presided over by Mr. Madhab Ch. Patowary, Head Master i/c of Pachgaon H.S. School. In this connection, a news letter entitled "ENVIRONMENT NEWS" edited by Dr. Dilip Kumar Deka, HOD, Dept.

of Environmental Science, was released by Dr. (Mrs.) Krishna Barman, Principal of the college. In the meeting, Mr. Dambaru Saikia from Horticulture Research Centre, Kahikuchi demonstrated the preparation of Vermicompost. In his lecture, he emphasised on using such type of non-chemical manure which is almost five times superior to others, in any kind of cultivation.

A survey on Solid Waste Management in the Pachgaon area was conducted by some of the teachers and students of Pachgaon H.S. School. The survey was based on fifty families from different communities of the locality. The report of the survey was presented by Asst. teacher of the school Mr. Kanak Sarma. Finally, the winners of the Art Competition were presented certificates and prizes.

Hopefully such type of awareness camp will create an awareness about the environmental protection and solid waste management among the school students. In the near future also the college is willing to organise such type of awareness camps in different areas of the state.

35th College Foundation Day of L. C. Bharali College

The College celebrated its 35th Foundation Day on 9th & 10th of August,2005. Mr. BP Goswami, President, GB unfurled the college flag at 9-30 am amidst the applause of students, teachers and non-teaching staff. This was followed by the speech of Dr. Krishna Barman, Principal. In her address she dwelt at length upon the overall development of the college, urging students and teachers alike to work together.

This year's Annual Lecture was delivered by Mr. Hemen Das, the film director, actor and writer on film technology/cine art. A two-day film show programme was also arranged befitting the topic. Guwahati Cine Club generously accommodated the show.

The first day's show started with the screening of *Jooj* (The Fight) a film by Mr. Das himself, that was awarded with the prestigious Rajat Kamal National Award in 1990. After the screening of the film Mr. Das gave a few clues regarding the themes and subthemes of the film such as untold love, animal-human relationship, privileged/unprivileged opposition. He also interacted with the audience answering their queries and sharing his experiences of making the film.

Steven Spielberg's classic Schindler's List was exhibited in the second half. The following day, while giving his speech Mr. Das emphasized that cinema is not merely technology, it is a substantial art. He touched upon various aspects of film technology/cine art, like sound treatment—background music, environmental sound; shot division, close shot, big close shot, long shot; reel—16mm film and 35mm film, cinemascope film; special effect; censor U, U/A, special certificate and so on.

Commemorating the 50th year of *Pather Panchali*, a pathbreaker in the history of Indian cinema, the film was shown in the first half, initiated by a few comments by Mr. Das on its importance as an all time great human document. The programme came to a close with the screening of *The Rain*, the Oscar nominated Iranian film on the issue of Afghan immigrants.

সংস্কৃতি বিনিময় কাৰ্য্যক্ৰম উপলক্ষত দিয়া আদৰণি ভাষণ

আমি গভীর আনন্দের সঙ্গে আপনাদের এবং অসমের মহাবিদ্যালয়ের ছাত্রছাত্রীদের সাদর অভ্যর্থনা জানাচ্ছি। সংস্কৃতি বিনিময় কার্য্যক্রম বাCultural Exchange আমাদের দিক থেকে একটি অভিনব পদক্ষেপ সন্দেহ নেই। অত্যন্ত স্বাস্থ্যকর ত'বটেহ উপরস্তু আমাদের নিজদেরও আপনাদের সাহচর্য্যে সমৃদ্ধ হওয়ার অবকাশ আছে।

সংস্কৃতি বিনিময় কার্য্যক্রমে আসাম এই বঙ্গদেশের যোগ্য সঙ্গী হতে পারে এই কারণে এই প্রতিবেশী প্রদেশটির সঙ্গে আমাদের ঐতিহাসিক, ভাষিক, রাজনৈতিক ও ভৌগোলিক যোগ বহুদিনের।

এত' আমাদের জানাই আছে যে – প্রত্ন নব্য ভারতীয় আর্য্যভাষার পূর্বীশাখা থেকে বঙ্গ ও অসমীয়া ওই দুই উপভাষার বিকাশ – কিছুদিন, মাত্র কিছু শতাব্দী আগেই ঐ দুই উপভাষা ভাষাগত পার্থক্যকে আয়ত্ব করেছে। আমরা বঙ্গসাহিত্যের ইতিহাসের আদি মধ্যযুগের কবি নারায়ন দেবকে এই পুন্যঅবসরে স্মরণ করতেই পারি যিনি এই দুই ভাষার সাহিত্যের ইতিহাসের কম্পিত মধ্যসেত্বতে দাঁড়িয়ে আছেন।

অসম ও বাংলাদেশ সম্ভবত এই ঔপভাষিক সংলগ্নতার কারনেই ইংরেজ আমলেও অভিন্ন প্রদেশ সীমার অন্তর্গত ছিল তাও ত' আমাবা জানি। উপরস্তু সংস্কৃত ইতিহাসের কথাও স্মরণ করতে হয়। উত্তর ও উত্তর পূর্ব বঙ্গদেশ এমনকি গাঙ্গেয় বঙ্গদেশের মানুষদের সঙ্গে অসমের মানুষের নৃতাত্ত্বিক মিল ত'স্পষ্টই – তদুপরি–সংকৃতির ক্ষেত্রে–গৌড়বঙ্গের চৈতন্যদেব ও অসমের শঙ্করদেব–উভয় যুগস্রস্টার তুন্যতা ইতিহাসে স্বীকৃত – এবং উভয়ের প্রভাব সন্নিপাতে উভয় প্রদেশেরই সংস্কৃতিধারা প্রভাবিত। নদীমাতৃক এই দুই প্রদেশেরই সংস্কৃতি জলীয় সরসতায় প্রানবন্ড, লোকসঙ্গীতের সুরে স্পন্দিত। রাঢ়বঙ্গ,বারেন্দ্রভূমি, মৈমনসিংহ হয়ে বরাক ভূমি –সুরের আসাযাওয়ারই ইতিহাস। আব তারই জন্য আমরাও অসমের দুটি মহাবিদ্যালয়ের সঙ্গে সংস্কৃতি বিনিময়ে উৎসাহী হয়ে পড়েছি।

অসমের শিলচরস্থিত কেন্দ্রিয় বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ে ত'বটেই অন্যএও সচেতন পাঠকের মনে বঙ্গসাহিত্যের আসন পাকা – এ আমরা জানি। বঙ্গবিদ্যাচর্চার যে কটি কেন্দ্র বঙ্গদেশের বাহিরে প্রতিষ্ঠিত বরাক উপত্যকা তার মধ্যে উল্লেখ্য যোগ্য – যাদবপুর বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের মানবী বিদ্যাচর্চা বিভাগ থেকে প্রকাশিত অসমের মহিলা কথাকার দের গল্প লীলা রায় পুরস্কার লাভ করেছে। এই বিনিময়ের প্রেক্ষাপটেই আমি বিবেকানন্দ মহিলা মহাবিদ্যালয়ে আপনাদের স্থাগত জানাচ্ছি। 'অয়মারম্ভ শুভায়ভবতু।'

College starts diploma in Computers

July 24: The Lalit Chandra Bharali College has started a two-year postgraduate diploma in computer applications (PGDCA) from the current academic session.

Though sponsored by the college itself, the University Grants Commission (UGC) will provide the necessary financial assistance. The department is operating the course with adequate manpower and infrastructure.

Moreover, the college has also introduce some standard courses sponsored by the Department of Electronics Accredited Computer Courses Centre (DOEACC), the DOEACC Olevel and A-level courses.


"The DOEACC O-level certificate is recognised as equivalent to the foundation level course by the Union Government for the purpose of employment, according to the notifications 43 and 49 dated March 1, 1995, and April 10, 1996, respectively by the Union Human Resourse Development Ministry. After qualifying at the DOEACC O-level, a student can go in for further levels A, B and C under the DOEACC Society. Among these, A-level courses have been introduced in the college recently," said Krishna Barman, Principal in-charge of the college.

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NACC) has granted permission to all its graded colleges to introduce such short-terms courses along with regular courses for the overall growth of its students.

The eligibility criteria for obtaining admission into the course will be graduation in computer science or physics from any recognised university. The seats will, however, be filled through entrance examinations and

interviews and the course is open to students from other institutions. The fee structure of the course is inexpensive.

Situated at the foothills of the Nilachal Hills, the college was established on August 9,1971, and launched with the generous financial help of the donor, after whom the college is named, to cater to the students of the city's periphery.
