History

LCB College was founded in 1971 as a night college by a group of teachers and operated from the premises of Maligaon Railway Higher Secondary School. At the initial stage, it catered mostly to undergraduate working men and women. It was at the initiative of the neighborhood community and the generous donation made by the family of Lalit Chandra Bharali that facilitated the purchase of its own land in 1972 and it was only from the next year that the college functioned for the first time from its own premises and since then it is the Governing Body that constitutes the primary management system of the college.

The establishment of the college was driven by a holistic approach towards higher education to the marginal student community who could not access the central/city colleges for various reasons. It was also an educational outreach for students who lived beyond the city limits and the entire Northeast. However, since the last two decades, the college has notched up its credibility as it attracts some of the best students from the entire northeast region for its non-traditional subjects at the UG level.

Another USP of the college is the natural ambience that prevails in the campus. It is nestled in the foothills of the beautiful Nilachal (abode of the Goddess Kamakhya) and Adingiri Hills, providing an idyllic environment for teaching and learning.

Facilities

Central Library

The college has a well equipped library with a collection of around 19000 (nineteen thousand) text and reference books, 30 periodicals and 13 newspapers of national and international repute. It follows open access system and using SOUL software (an integrated Library Management Software) developed by INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad for library automation. It also introduced Barcode for smooth running of day-to-day library works. Students are allowed to borrow books against library borrower's card. The students must follow the existing rules and regulations of the Library.

Awards and Incentives

◆ College Merit Prize

Students securing the highest aggregate marks in TDC Final Examination (Arts, Science and Commerce) will be awarded Late Ratneshwar Borooah Memorial Award, each of which carries a cash award of Rs.5000/- and a certificate.

◆ Students' Aid Fund

The College has a Students' Aid Fund to help the poor but meritorious students of the College. Students having 75% of class attendance are eligible to apply for this aid. During 2015-16, eleven students received financial aid from this fund.

◆ Students Relief Fund

The fund is specially used for the students affected by different natural calamities like flood, fire, earthquake, etc.

Laboratories

- a) The **Department of Computer Science and Information Technology** has two periodically upgraded A/C Laboratories for approximately 100 students. The networking of the Laboratories is compliant as per Central Authentication Mechanism, which is based on Client Server Technology. The Department also has a Laboratory equipped with Micro-Processor Kit.



- b) The **Department of Electronics** has a periodically upgraded A/C Laboratory with a capacity of approximately 30 students for basic Electronics. There is a separate set-up for Digital Electronics for 20 students with its own computational facility.
- c) The **Department of Physics** has two fully equipped Laboratories.
- d) The **Department of Education** also has a Laboratory with modern equipments.

Photocopying

This facility is available in the college campus for all students.

Magazine

The College magazine “LCBIAN” is published annually. It provides a platform to students to express their views and creativity through various forms of writings.



Audio-visual Aid

The college has the facility of Digital Class Room. LCD projector and Sound systems are used as important aids for holding seminars, workshops and for teaching and learning process.

Power Back-up

The college has a Power House with a capacity of 62.5 KV to meet the demand of electricity for the whole campus during power failure.

Canteen

Canteen facility is available within the college campus for the students, teachers and other employees.

Campus interview

The college has the provision of holding Campus interview for placement of the students. Different multinational companies like TCS, IBM, Wipro, Infosys, etc. have recruited a good number of students through campus interview during the last few years.

Hostel

The college has a Girls' Hostel with all modern amenities, which can accommodate 60 (sixty) students.

Wi-Fi Campus

The entire campus is equipped with Wi-Fi network.

Drinking Water

Pure drinking water equipped with Aquaguard and cooler is available in the campus.



Health Club

The college has a Health Club that conducts lectures and awareness programmes on health related issues. A Health Center equipped with basic instruments is also managed by the Club under the aegis of a Doctor; who has been appointed to look into health concerns of the students and employees of the college, from time to time.

Remedial Coaching

There is a provision for Remedial Coaching using UGC Assistance in the college for degree students belonging to SC/ ST/ OBC (non-creamy layer)/ minorities/ economically deprived/ physically challenged category.

Students' Union

The Lalit Chandra Bharali College Students' Union (LCBCSU) is the General Body of the Students of the College. Its membership is compulsory for every student. Office bearers are elected annually as per the constitution of the Students' Union.

Regular Evaluation System

Regular Sessional Tests are held throughout the year and credits of these tests are carried over to the TDC final examinations.

Co-Curricular Activities and Extension Education Programme

The College considers extension work as the third dimension s of instruction and regards it as important as the other two dimensions viz., teaching-learning and research. This is due to the consideration that extension activities are beneficial for inculcating a sense of dedication to social upliftment and accountability among students. The college initiates extension education with its own fund. These activities are carried out through the Extension Education Cell and other cells.

Types of Extension work

Academic Extension Activities

The college organizes Departmental Lectures, Seminars, workshops, etc. with the involvement of existing teachers, librarian and invited experts, so that interdisciplinary knowledge can be transmitted among the teachers and the students.

Extension through Awareness

The college is organizing some awareness programme on different areas like primary health, drug abuse, AIDS, blood donation, etc. within and outside the college campus.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS is a voluntary organization of the Student under the aegis of the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports established in 1989 to inculcate social consciousness and sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labour among the youth. The college unit of the NSS is vibrant with activities and organizes a number of health education programmes each year under the guidance of the Project Officer.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC is a National organization which helps in inculcating the spirit of courage, confidence, self-reliance, self-service, patriotism, faith in oneself, power of thinking and adjustment which are essential to make the youth disciplined and dutiful. The College NCC unit is attached to the 50 Assam Air Sqr. (Fly) NCC.

Students' Feedback

The college has designed a Student Feedback Form, through which students are asked to provide their comments regarding teaching-learning/ evaluation (teacher-wise) process. Information provided in this regard is analyzed by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and necessary measures are taken for improving the quality of education in the college.

Alumni Association

An Institution of higher learning needs active co-operation and support from its Alumni for its overall growth. The college holds the Alumni meet, at least once a year and some important decisions are taken for all round growth and development of the institution. A good number of Alumni are holding prominent positions in the society.



General Information

- ❑ Regular attendance in class is compulsory for the students. Willful absence from the class is treated as serious breach of College discipline.
- ❑ A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat.
- ❑ Students must attend 75% of classes to appear in the final examinations.
- ❑ Identity Card will be issued to each student to be kept by him/ her during College hours. Any loss or damage of Identity card must be reported immediately to the college authority.
- ❑ Students will have to wear only the approved uniform inside the college campus.
- ❑ Mobile phone must be switched off inside the college campus.
- ❑ Ragging is strictly prohibited. Anyone found indulging in any act of Ragging will be dealt as per rules.
- ❑ Any form of sexual harassment may be reported to the College Authority/ the Coordinator of the Committee (CASH) by means of written complaints.
- ❑ Students are entitled to avail student concession to travel offered by different agencies as per rule.
